

It might surprise you to learn that Paul is also a scientist and inventor. He invented a plastic heart, called "The Winchell Heart." Science and laughter, say Paul, are the world's best medicines. We have now learned that he is writing an autobiographical novel titled "The Strange Saga of Jimmy Flood" that will closely parallel his own life and career.

We were hoping that this matter would be put to rest at that time but, during the past several months, we have continued to receive a flood of mail and telephone calls, from all over the U.S., about these "knock offs." Our Board of Directors has elected to publish some of these letters.

I used to subscribe to your Newsletter but, unfortunately, let my subscription expire. I still collect Smurfs and am always on the lookout for a new one for my collection. I know you get many toy and collectible publications. I've seen the Club's ads in them all. Well, I'm writing to you about an ad I saw in many such publications. Twenty Four Smurfs for \$10.00. What a buy, the bargain of the year!!!! Well, this old girl got TAKEN!!! I just don't want it to happen to any other true blue Smurf collectors. I received the box today. Visions of Bully markings and rare variations filled my head. I was never so disappointed. In the parcel rest 24 very poor imitations of Smurfs. These were poorly painted with NO markings. I believe these were made in Mexico. I should have known it was too good to be true! If you aren't aware of it I hope this will save other real collectors from making the mistake of ordering these. Maybe if I still subscribed to your Newsletter I would have been more up to date on any fake offerings. Please pass this to other potential buyers and fellow collectors. Please send me another application to start subscribing. I miss reading all the Smurf Scoop. I still read my back issues.

Also, the sellers are charging TOP, PREMIUM PRICES for these pieces. PLEASE TELL OUR MEMBERS!!!

Dear S.C.C.I.;

"UPSET" and "DISTURBED" are understatements that scarcely describe my ANGER at this moment. I AM IRATE!!!! ENRAGED!!!!

I have just returned home from a very popular Toy and Collectible show here on the East Coast. I look forward to this show every year because it gives me an opportunity to discuss collectibles with many knowledgeable toy dealers and fellow collectors.

To Make a long story brief and to-the-point, I visited with many long-time toy dealer friends and was informed that another dealer, supposedly a Smurf collector herself, was selling COUNTERFEIT Smurfs at \$5.00 each. Through further conversations and investigation, I learned that this dealer was also misleading the public with half-truths and totally false statements! The following is a word-for-word quotation:

"Smurfs Made in Mexico, no markings on these Smurfs. The painting is not as finely detailed as usual, but most of the colors vary greatly from the usual! These are WHITE INJECTED MOLDED. MOST SMURFS ARE BLUE INJECTED."

I, for one, will never purchase another item from this dealer! I collect other cartoon character collectible's that she also sells but, no matter how badly I may want an item, I refuse to support such an unscrupulous person by giving her my business! Such a sad and disturbing story. Why would a formerly reputable collector-dealer wreck her credibility by venturing into such a misleading business practice?

Please be cautious about ordering through the mail. I learned that these counterfeit Smurfs sell, packed 24 to-a-bag, for \$10.00. THESE ARE WORTHLESS AND NOT ENTITLED TO A PLACE IN OUR COLLECTIONS!

Our thanks to all of you who were thoughtful enough to write in an effort to inform and warn. We are certain you have saved many fellow members from being deceived. A knowledgeable collector is a confident and secure collector.

We would like to add one last comment with regard to the quotation contained in the above letter: The vast majority of AUTHENTIC Smurfs ARE INJECTED IN WHITE, NOT Blue!!!!!!

## PROMOTIONAL SMURF QUEST

The following tells the tale of one of the most challenging investigations the Club has undertaken since it's inception in 1986. Yes, these Promotional figurines have been under investigation for more than three years!

We are happy to report that many or most of our questions have been answered satisfactorily and we can now present our findings to you, our members.

How did it all begin? One of our very first members who joined in May 1986, wrote: "I have in my collection, #20080 Biscuit. He is CHOCOLATE BROWN with a red mouth and tongue." The Club's first step, in such a case, is to request that the figurine be submitted to the Club for verification. This is the procedure we use for any figurine that is unknown to us.

Upon close examination by the Club's Board of Directors, this all brown injected #20080 proved to be of the exact size, detailing, quality, etc., of the legitimate Schleich #20080 Biscuit mold. Although the figurine bore no markings (which WILL happen on a rare occasion) we did feel that this figurine was important enough to research further. How could we have foreseen that our investigation would take more than THREE YEARS and hundreds of letters.

While our investigation was under way, the owner of #20080 (the Brown Biscuit under scrutiny), actively sought more of these figurines and, in three years, has been successful in accumulating a very impressive collection. Below is his story, as of this printing. Following his story, the Club will list figurines that we verified through our investigation. In addition, you will see the Club's final and absolute proof that these figurines were manufactured by Bully and/or the Schleich factory for a European Candy Company.

### SOLID - COLOR SMURFS

By "DR. SMURF" from PA.

Having collected Smurfs for most of the past twenty years, I am fascinated that early on I received an example of 20080 Biscuit, that is a solid milk chocolate brown except for a red line painted to the mouth and a red tongue and bright blue eyes void of pupils. Although it is perfectly formed and of exact size, there are no identifying markings. Initially, I was suspicious and it was months and perhaps years later that I began to find additional SOLID COLORED figurines, perfectly formed and of exact size. Fortunately, many of these do contain authentic markings and so my original suspicion has been dampened. Rather, I now consider them legitimately manufactured for a purpose that has not been disclosed to me. Perhaps someone out there can shed some light on them. At any rate, I have the following figurines in my collection:

1. 20018 Crying A solid, slightly shiny, bright YELLOW injected mold (except for the whites of the eyes with black pupils and a white tear).  
On the bottom of the left foot: W. Germany/Peyo c.  
On the bottom of the right foot: Stickman marking.
2. 20019 Flower A solid medium VIOLET injected mold with a black line on the closed eyelids and mouth. It has no flower but the opening for the stem is present.  
On the bottom of the left foot: W. Germany/Peyo c.  
On the bottom of the right foot: Stickman marking.
3. 20021 Sleepwalker A solid RED injected mold except for a black line on the closed eyelids.  
On the bottom of the left foot: c/W. Germany/Peyo.
4. 20074 King A solid deep GREEN injected mold with white eyes and black pupils.  
On the bottom: Bully/Peyo c W. Germany
5. 20018 Crying A solid bright GREEN injected mold except for black pupils and a white tear and red mouth.  
On the bottom of the left foot: W. Germany/Peyo c.
6. 20080 Biscuit As described above.  
There is no lettering on this figurine.
7. 20081 Tyrolean A solid shiny bright GREEN injected mold with black eyes and eyebrows.  
On the chest between the straps: c Peyo.
8. 20081 Tyrolean A shiny deep glossy RED injected mold with black eyes and black eyebrows.  
On the bottom of the heels: c Peyo.
9. 20081 Tyrolean Very close to #8 but a deeper shiny CHERRY RED injected mold.  
On the bottom of the heels: c Peyo.  
On the bottom of the right toe: in a circle, Bully.  
On the bottom of the left toe: in a circle, W. Germany.

10. 20081 Tyrolese A shiny medium ORANGE injected mold with black mouth and black pupils.  
On the bottom of the right foot: Bully/W. Germany.  
On the bottom of the left heel: Peyo.

11. 20083 Hammer ORANGE injected mold with black pupils and a white sweat dot lateral to the right eye.  
There is no lettering on this figure.

12. 20083 Hammer Very close to #11 with a flatter ORANGE injected mold.  
On the handle of the hammer: c Peyo.

13. 20083 Hammer A very shiny CHERRY RED injected mold.  
On the bottom of the right foot: Bully/W. Germany  
On the bottom of the left foot: c Peyo.

The following is a list of the solid-color injected figurines that the CLUB has verified as being a part of this promotion:

1. 20022 Author ORANGE injected mold.
2. 20023 Rock N Roll YELLOW injected mold.
3. 20076 Courting PURPLE injected mold.
4. 20079 Jolly RED injected mold.
5. 20043 Digger RARE BULLY MOLD, ROYAL BLUE injected mold.
6. 20082 Shy YELLOW injected mold.

And now, we come to the conclusion of our three-year QUEST! The BOX OF CANDY shown below proves, beyond doubt, the authenticity of this EUROPEAN PROMOTION and that it is the source of the mysterious SOLID COLOR SMURFS. THESE ARE THE WALDBAUR PROMOTIONAL SMURF FIGURINES!!!!!!



ON THE BACK OF THE BOX,  
CLEARLY SHOWN IN COLOR:

JOLLY (RED)  
SHY (YELLOW)  
TYROLESE (GREEN)  
RARE DIGGER (ROYAL BLUE)  
HAMMER (ORANGE)

Each box contained 20 pieces  
of Chocolate Candy and one  
figurine.

To our dismay, this story ALMOST HAD TO BE SCRAPPED!!!! Upon receipt of this original box, we looked it over (& over & over) but could not find any proof that it was LICENSED!!!!!! NO "PEYO", NO COPYRIGHT, ETC. ON THE BOX.

Fortunately, the day was saved when we received the Wallace Berrie Licensing Procedure Book (See Club Bulletin, Summer, 1989). LO AND BEHOLD, the Waldbaur Candy Promotion was featured!

A few remaining questions linger. Maybe someday we will have all the answers. We DO know that Walbauer also gave out REGULAR Smurf figurines with this candy as well. Why did Peyo permit Red, Yellow, Green, etc., colored figurines to be injected for this promotion? Such un Smurfy colors! Why did this box not bear the proper Copyrights?

We have reason to believe that this PROMOTION started in the early-to-mid 1970's!

**SPECIAL NOTE:** Waldbaur Promotional Smurf Figurines are NOT to be confused with the Club's RAW FIGURINES! The RAW figurines are all properly injected (Colors) and have NO PAINTED DETAILS.

I am writing to tell you about my trip. First and foremost what a lovely country; beautiful scenery and very friendly people. I was nervous about not knowing the language when I first arrived but their willingness to show how well they can speak English and our willingness to laugh over our poor excuse of speaking German made communication rather fun and pleasant.

As I quickly found out Smurfs do not abound in Munich or Salzburg (the two cities I visited). In fact, what appeared to be selling best was "ALF" and Disney characters. I considered my 1st day there my greatest triumph. In fact, less than an hour after I unpacked my clothes, I was out roaming the streets for Flea Markets. Much to my surprise, tucked away in a little alley very close to our hotel, was this mini Flea Market. In one corner, three very small boys were selling their proud possessions from a shoe box. Upon looking into this particular box I was delighted to find Smurfs; specifically, Smurf FINGER PUPPETS.\* As I had never seen these before, I was ecstatic. The boys were as thrilled to rid themselves of these as I was to purchase them. What I ended up getting was a complete set of FINGER PUPPETS plus some extra ANGRY SMURF PUPPETS. The PVC heads twist easily onto the plastic bases. None of them have any markings concerning year or place of manufacture. I will consider putting the extra Angry (Black) Finger Puppets up for sale for those members who desire them.

In this same market I came across two Ferrero pieces dated 1988 of two soccer players. These were featured in the Club's back issues.

Most interesting was the Smurf I found with wooden shoes. Dated 1980, W. Germany. This figure sported yellow shoes and had a clear plexiglass thermometer-type stick in his hands. The top-whatever it was-had been broken off and the poor thing looks like he had a rough life. Can you enlighten me on this figurine? \*\*

I went into Munich's big department store and, stashed away in a bin that was not commanding a great deal of store visibility, I found some more Smurfs. Not cheap; some as much as \$4.00 each. I guess the \$1.50 days are gone forever! Of the twenty five or so pieces that I found, I determined about 8 variations of figurines that I already have. Most are the new bright shiny blue.


In addition, I was able to find one Smurf glass that looks like it may have been a jelly jar, a small Smurf pad of paper, and a round black plastic key ring. Otherwise, everything Smurfy was non-existent. I was somewhat disappointed about that but, as you see, my prize possession from the trip is the photo I had taken of me: On our excursion one day to the Castle of King Ludwig we stopped for shopping for 20 minutes in the Passion Play Town of Oberammergau and what to my wondering eyes should appear but a Papa Smurf Boat. Had I been able to speak the language I would have questioned how much it was and had it shipped home. I had a feeling they wouldn't have sold it anyway and so the next best thing was to pose with Papa.

Anyway, this is all I found in Germany! Though I didn't find too many Smurfy things I had a WONDERFUL TRIP.
