"Although we had planned a broad-range launch of Smurf products for 1990, the program was unsuccessful. There was a small amount of gift merchandise sold. Please inform the members of the S.C.C.I. that they can contact their local Applause retailer and ask them to special-order for them.

Regarding Hardees; there will not be any further Smurf promotions.

Apparently, the market conditions are simply not conducive to a Smurf program at this time so you won't be seeing new products in '91.

Applause Licensing

In Newsletter 17, we were not optimistic about the news of the relaunch coming on the heels of the Smurf cartoon being canceled. Although the cartoon now appears in syndication in most areas of the U.S., their familiarity rating will undoubtedly drop to way below its 93% rating in the coming years.

All we can do at this point is discuss the few Smurf products that did appear in the U.S. for the 1990 relaunch. Our hopes for new products, once again, depends on the European market. Our hopes remain high!

Smurf Messengers - 4 styles of plush Smurfs each with a message on his shirt 5½" size: "Have a Happy Day!" "I Smurf You!" "Have a Smurfy Birthday!" "Keep on Smurfin!"

"Papa Smurf" 10", "Slouchy" 8", "Sassette" 8", "Nat" 8",
"Smurfette" 10", "Snappy" 8", "Smurf" 10".

Last, but not least, 11 Smurf figurines but, to our great disappointment, all 11 figurines are old releases (no NEW figurine designs that we do not have).

We will be happy to supply you with photos of the above-mentioned favorites to add to your Club catalogs. Please submit your request with a S.A.S.E.

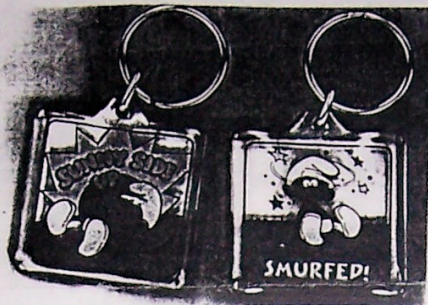
From the Editors desk.....

When we use the description "yellow" it refers to any yellow which is the same as Smurfette's yellow HAIR. When we use the term yellow/gold there is more orange in the yellow color, so it appears as yellow/gold.

A perfect example of this is figurine #20231 Hula Smurfette. The original figurine was issued with yellow/gold hair. She was later corrected and has yellow hair. If you have these variations please refer to them.

The article in our last Newsletter, "Rare Schleich Mold Unearthed," about the Tennis Player one-piece mold with tennis ball was truly enjoyable. EUROPEAN PROMOTIONAL SMURF.....

A.S.B.

German..Arbeiter Samariter Bund
English..Worker's Samaritan Group or Organization

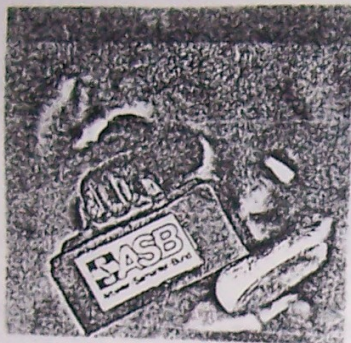
("good Samaritan": one who gives help or sympathy to those in distress)

This promotional figurine, No. 20054, is produced for the above European organization which is similiar to the Red Cross.

The emblem on the figurine's shirt is a dark orange circle; on the inside of the circle is a lighter orange cross with a dark orange "S" going through the cross.

The medical case is a medium brown with blue latches. The case bears a sticker with the same emblem that appears on the figurine's chest; ASB in yellow with red outlines. In tiny little red letters, on the bottom of the sticker, the following is printed: Arbeiter Samariter Bund.

Our investigation shows that this promotional figurine has been produced for a number of years. It apparently continues to be made to this day as the one featured below bears the CE 1990 marking.



PEWTER SMURFS.....

Numerous inquiries have come into Club Headquarters requesting information on Pewter Smurf figurines. They were produced, to the best of our knowledge, by American Pewter in the early 80's. We have been told that this company is out of business so it has been difficult to gather information for you, our members, about their line of pewter Smurf items.

Our investigation revealed that these are a licensed "Peyo" product.

The following is a list of pewter Smurfs, and related pewter pieces produced. All have been verified by the Club. If you have pewter figurines NOT listed, please send us the information to share with our members. We do know that this list is NOT complete; there are others.

Supers: Canoe, Wheelbarrow, Skateboard.

Playsets: Picnic table & seats, Flower on base, Wheelbarrow (without figurines).

Special Note: Some of the figurines are on pewter bases.

MYSTERY SMURF!!!!!!

Cast your eyes upon this Christmas ornament Figurine with cord. "BELL RINGER" is it's name. It appeared just once in an older Schleich catalog and never again has it been seen! Where is it? What happened to it? The picture shown is not a sketch; it is a photograph of an actual manufactured piece!

Our sources tell us: "As for the Christmas Smurf holding the Bell, this Figurine has never been produced because of Technical problems."

These are the things that keep us on our toes here at the Club. If ONE was manufactured for the photo, more HAD to have been made! Where are they? It's maddening to know that someone, somewhere, must have the ornament! If any Club members have one they had better place their treasure in a safe deposit box or change their address!

Does anyone admit to owning this piece? If so, verification for our records would be deeply appreciated!!

Well, guess what, Smurf Collectors? It has taken ³ years, but the "Bell Ringer" has, at long last, been verified as being owned by one of our European members!!!

Not only has the "Bell Ringer" been verified, but two additional Christmas figurines, heretofore known to us, have been verified as well!

1. Kneeling Baby Smurf, with gold angel wings, clutching the red ribbon wrapped around a white gift box.
2. Smurf wearing a green scarf, with holly on his hat. A red & white boot is beside him containing a red & white candy cane and a white gift box tied with green ribbon.

Description of the "Bell Ringer"

The "Bell Ringer" holds a gold bell with a green bow tied around it. He has a red pompon on his hat, green scarf, and red jacket with white trim.

The "Bell Ringer" was produced as a Christmas cord figurine. The other two figurines may have been produced as cords or just as plain Christmas figurines; the facts are unclear at the moment. Our investigation continues.....

Markings

The markings found on these figurines are, 1984, Peyo, Schleich and, much to our surprise, W. Berrie Co. Made in Portugal.

These markings lead us to believe that the figurines were designed for the American Market as well as the European Market.

Why didn't these figurines ever go into production? We can only speculate that this was about the time Wallace Berrie/Applause ceased buying molds to produce new designs.

You will recall that, in 1985, a special Limited Collectors Series was launched by Applause (Division of Wallace Berrie & Co. Inc.). Their promotional display promised 16 different designs but the series was never completed for the U.S. Fortunately, we were able to get the six final issues of that famous series from Schleich.

A photocopy of the above mentioned store display is available from the Club. Submit your request with a S.A.S.E.

The Board of Directors of the S.C.C.I. feels that this is an important discovery, that warrants our "going the extra mile." We are, therefore, providing you with a color photograph of these three very extraordinary figurines.
