

Each "A SMURFY TRIBUTE TO PEACE" L.E. figurine will come with a **NUMBERED CERTIFICATE OF AUTHENTICITY** from the Smurf Collectors' Club International. Each figurine purchased will be **REGISTERED** with the Club and this information will be kept on file. If ownership should be transferred, the figurine must be accompanied by its Certificate of Authenticity and the Club is to be notified of the transaction. Following this procedure in transferring ownership protects the value of the Limited Edition figurine.

To newer members and to those who missed out on previous S.C.C.I. Limited Edition figurines, a gentle reminder: Each year the Limited Edition Club figurine is only available to the first 250 renewing members. With a yearly enrollment far exceeding that number, it is imperative that you submit your renewal within two weeks of receiving this notice if you hope to purchase one for your collection. After this two week period all new members, joining us for year 9, will become eligible to scoop one up for their collections. In the past, previously issued L.E. I enjoyed reading the Nostalgia article in our last Newsletter, "The Little Card Shop going out of Business." It brought back memories of "The Good Old Days." Back in 1980, my son, then six years old, would run off the School Bus every day and telephone a little card shop in our area that carried Smurfs. His most exciting days were when he was told "THE SHIPMENT IS IN!" With great zeal he would yell out "Mom, the shipment of Smurfs is in, let's go." No matter how busy I was I had to drop everything and take him to the Smurf store.

Most of the time the Smurf parcels were not even opened yet by the shopkeeper. My son's face would light up with excitement when the manager of the store would open the cartons and let my son be the first to see what was new.

He shouted in glee as each new item appeared. Talk about variations, he really knew his figurines! He could spot a paint variation at once; it was amazing to me. I'd tell him, "We have that Smurf" and he would say, "No Mommy, this one is different from the one I have." Ten times out of ten he was right! He never missed a variation. He never failed. But Mom did. Sometimes there were so many new figurines and supers that I had to say NO to his variations. These were the days I'm still kicking myself about. All those paint variations we would love to have today.

Does anyone remember the Christmas of 1981? It was almost impossible to find the new Gargamel & Azrael Super Smurf. The stores had sold out in a matter of a few hours. It wasn't until January of 1982 that we were able to locate one. I remember our "Smurf Shop" had a huge sign painted for their window:

GARGAMEL AND AZRAEL ARE HERE!!!!!!

I miss those **GOOD OLD DAYS** and the exciting **"MOM A SMURF SHIPMENT IS IN, LET'S GO!"**

I always read all ads very carefully as I pick-up information on variations to add to my collection or, if I miss out on an Ad, at least I know about the variation and add it to my want list.

Upon checking my Chimney Sweep Supers, I find they all have the ladder you describe, yet I feel I must be missing something because of the way the Ad was written. I have re-read all my back-issue Newsletters (my Smurfy Bible, so to speak) and I can't find any information on this Super.

Would you please explain the wording of this Ad and let me know if I missed something.

Dear Cherly and All Members,

You are 100% correct! There was a reason for the Ad being worded as it was!

Although we have not gotten into Super Smurf variations yet in our Newsletters, a few MAJOR variations are listed in the Super Smurf Section of the Club Brochure. This Chimney Sweep variation has not appeared before.

In 1978, when Chimney Sweep was first issued, the ladder had 4 steps (rungs). Around 1983, the ladder was changed to 7 steps (rungs).

MORE ABOUT THE "SMURFETTE BIRTHDAY CERAMICS".

We would be negligent if we did not do more than show a photo of these porcelain Smurfette figurines.

Many of our members have expressed the feeling that this set is one of the most beautiful and treasured items in their collections.

Through information we have gathered over the years, it seems apparent that numerous areas of the U.S. never had this series for sale. Many of our collectors have told us they never knew about or even saw this series.

Various sources have informed us that production was limited to just one firing which could mean that only a few thousand were produced; nowhere near the production number one would expect.

This series was produced in beautiful pastel colors with lovely feminine details. A description of each figurine follows:

- Number One: Smurfette, standing with a Teddy Bear-topped "ONE." Another Teddy Bear is seated at the base of the number.
- Number Two: Smurfette, seated on the base of the "TWO." Balloons "float" atop the number.
- Number Three: Smurfette, leaning against the "THREE." She holds a pretty bouquet of flowers.
- Number Four: Smurfette, holding a watering can, with the "FOUR." A flower-filled pot is perched on the number.
- Number Five: Smurfette, with parasol, leaning against the "FIVE."
- Number Six: Smurfette ballerina, on pointe, beside her number "SIX."
- Number Seven: Smurfette holding the "SEVEN." Butterfly perched atop the number.
- Number Eight: Smurfette, wearing ice skates, holding the "EIGHT."
- Number Nine: Smurfette with the "NINE," her kite "flying" on top of the number.
- Number Ten: Smurfette with the "TEN." She is wearing rollerskates and is seated inside the zero.
- Number Eleven: Smurfette, as a very enthusiastic Cheerleader, with the "ELEVEN."
- Number Twelve: Smurfette, holding a single flower, seated on the two of the "TWELVE."

No doubt about it: These figurines are all charming and well-designed. Obviously, a good deal of thought went into their creation, from the choice of lovely pastel colors to the extra feminine touches that are perfectly suited to Smurfette (flowers and little birds, for example). To our minds, here at Club Headquarters, the dotted swiss effect given to the numbers is the icing on the cake! Bravo, artists, wherever you may be!

Interesting to note this series bears the markings: Wallace Berrie, 1983.

If you have this series, or remember seeing it in your area, we would love to hear from you. We are still attempting to track the original distribution areas of these beautiful porcelain figurines. Please write to us!







#20166 Pitcher

1. Green base, black shoes, red socks, white pants, black belt, red shirt, brown high gloss painted glove, white ball with heavy black stitching.
2. Green base, black shoes, red socks, white pants, black belt, red shirt, light brown dull painted glove, white ball with light black stitching.
