As mentioned in our last Newsletter, this is the logo that inspired our 9th year, Limited Edition, S.C.C.I. figurine.

Shortly before the death of "Peyo" he created this logo to support Environmental Awareness.

We are pleased to present the background story from Belgium.....

1992

The SMURFS live happily and peacefully in their mushroom-houses in the heart of the forest. It's a pity that this fairy world, created 33 years ago by **PEYO**, is threatened more and more by rampant pollution. If nothing is done about it very soon, the Smurf Universe will be relegated in a near future to a museum of the victims of progress.

That's why I.M.P.S. will spend the royalties of the logo "**SMURF THE WORLD**" recently created by **PEYO** to a new foundation bearing the same name. The aim is to make children and adults in the whole world conscious of the beauty and importance of our natural environment. Under the theme "**SMURF THE WORLD**", the fund will launch its own actions in this field and also support a certain number of selected ecological projects and recognized institutions.

The first initiative was the support of I.M.P.S. to the second international Green Fair in Brussels from 15th to 20th May this year. The "**SMURF THE WORLD**" logo was immediately adopted by the organizers. The SMURF stand at the Green Fair, where the objectives of the new fund were made clear, aroused the attention of many visitors, the press and the Excellencies assisting the opening. Mrs Onkelinx, Minister of Public Health and Environment,

congratulated **PEYO** for this initiative.

At this occasion the new fund was officially inaugurated in the form of a belgian A.S.B.L. (non-profit organization), to be presided by **PEYO** himself. In this manner, he provides his moral support and the international reputation of his blue heroes to further the aims of the fund and

ensure its success. In the near future, the fund will proceed to various tree-planting actions in urban areas, in conjunction with the local authorities and with the aid of schools. From now on, the SMURF license-holders using the "**SMURF THE WORLD**" logo contribute indirectly to all kinds of earth-saving actions, of vital importance for ourselves and our children. HOT SPOT

Fox to Launch New Cable Channel Featuring Live Community Shows

WHEN RUPERT MURDOCH reached out to recruit Nickelodeon executive Anne Sweeney to head up Fox' new cable channel, he was high on enthusiasm but short on specifics. There were already dozens of cable networks serving niche audiences and it was hard to imagine anything new.

"Rupert felt the 18- to 49-year-old audience was underserved," Sweeney says, explaining how Murdoch sketched out only a bare concept. "Frankly it struck me dumb for a moment."

Apparently Sweeney quickly came around. On June 1, Fox will launch FX, its first foray into the highly competitive cable TV network business. The cornerstone of the new channel will be its seven hours a day of live programing, a mixture of seat-of-the-pants entertainment and reruns of campy old series like "Fantasy Island" and "The Green Hornet."

FX is being billed as the first "general entertainment" cable channel to be launched in 15 years.

"They are creating a concept more 1950s in style, with the faults but also the benefits of live TV," says Robert Redella, vice president of programing at Cox Cable in Atlanta, one of the country's largest cable operators. "That's what's lacking in today's TV."

Fox executives are cagey about how many subscribers FX will have at launch, but they promise it will be

at least as many as the 17 million TNT had when it started in 1989, which was the biggest launch of a new network in cable history.

With 78 cable networks already in existence and another 75 on the drawing board in anticipation of the 500-channel universe, channel "surfing" is now the preferred viewing method for a whole generation.

Sweeney says Fox is aware of that and has developed a format for FX that is designed — in theory — to hold the viewer's attention: "The premise about this network is reconnecting with the viewer, and the route to that is to get into the local community."

Originating out of New York, FX will start with a live two-hour show titled "Breakfast Time," and proceed through the day alternating between live programing and old network reruns, capping with a late-night talk show called "Back Chat."

The live segments will include old chestnuts like "The Pet Show" and more novel ideas such as "Personal FX," where families holding garage sales will speak about what memories their belongings evoke — as well as a host taking calls from potential buyers.

FX will also dispatch a fleet of video vans around the country to visit communities, feeding back reports that will be integrated into various shows.

Despite the low-budget concept of many of the shows, Fox says it is spending \$100 million in programing during the first year.

From the EDITORS DESK....



WE ALL REMEMBER THIS!!! These displays were in our stores. Note that all of the figurines featured were sketches and not actual figurines. The four for January, 1985, arrived. The four for April, 1985, arrived in May. In July the two Baby Smurfs arrived and then we waited...and waited...and waited. The last six never appeared in the U.S.

This now leads us into the story of how and why the S.C.C.I. was born..read on....

We are pleased to present, for your reading enjoyment, the stories of "The Three Smurf-a-teers." How Susan, Gary and Suzanne, the founders of the S.C.C.I., started collecting, how they found each other and how the Smurfberry seed was planted for the birth of the Club.

GARY'S STORY

I gave my daughter, June, her first Smurf about July, 1981. She immediately liked it and I started to buy her one-a-day. In a short time I found that I had to have a list to keep track of all her Smurfs. I then discovered a collectors' book which had a listing of what I thought was all the Smurfs that were available. The Pointing Smurf was the only one that I did not have. After finally locating the Pointing Smurf, I was shopping in one of the local stores and found that they had many Smurfs that I had not seen in any other shops, nor in the previously mentioned book. I asked the clerk and she told me that these Smurfs had come from West Germany. Well, that opened an entire new area that I had to pursue.

I went from one store to another searching for new Smurfs.

It was approximately seven months later that I decided to start my own collection. I quickly got all the duplicates that I could get my hands on. My only fear was that I would not be able to get all the original ones that my daughter had in her collection. I was lucky to get all the pieces and then started to notice differences in the figures from West Germany, Hong Kong and Portugal. Colors on some of the figures were different. A glaze was used on the pieces from Hong Kong and not on all the pieces from West Germany. There was also a slight difference in the size of the figures.

At this point I started my third collection for my office. I became obsessed! I started buying up everything with a Smurf on it! This included not only the regular Smurfs and super Smurfs, but ceramics, pewter, buttons, belts, belt buckles, toys, jewelry, clothing, lunch boxes, shoes, magnets, barrette, coloring books, candles, puffy and regular smelly stickers, die cast metal cars, plush, earrings, rings, erasers, frisbees, drinking glasses, mugs, plates, needle craft kits, jewelry boxes, jig saw puzzles, key chains, necklaces, night lights, pen sets, shoe laces, roller skates, light catchers, watches, license plates and many other items.

June would invite her friends to our house and never tell them that she and her father were serious Smurf collectors. When they saw our collections, they were always amazed.

When I knew a friend was traveling abroad, I immediately asked them to go Smurf hunting for us and I provided a list and pictures of the items that we were seeking. Most of the time our friends were successful in bringing back pieces that we did not have.

Among the interesting items we have are posters and cards in Spanish, German music boxes, Smurf pencil sharpeners, pin cushions and 1" high figures that were among the original pieces produced many years ago. These 1" high figures have been discontinued and, therefore, are hard to find.

The company that made the belt buckles had gone out of business many years earlier; that collection would now be impossible to duplicate.

My most prized collection is the pewter Smurfs. I am missing only a few in this series. The manufacturer of these also went out of business many years ago.

SUSAN'S STORY

Naturally, my Smurfy days all came about because I was a Brownie Scout Troop leader.

Several of the little girls befriended my daughter and were invited to her Birthday party. She expressed her greatest pleasure when she unwrapped the smallest of her gifts, a strange blue object. Until that point in time, I was totally ignorant of the existence of Smurfs and, I must confess to thinking at the time, it was an odd present. The mother of the little girl who gave my daughter the Smurfette apologized for her daughter's choice of "such a weird present" and said she tried and failed to dissuade her child from giving the gift. The poor embarrassed woman even gave my daughter a pretty porcelain cup as an "apology gift."

After the party was over, I thought I would never hear the end of excited talk about "the best present ever!" THE SMURFETTE ROLLER SKATER! I took a longer, closer, look and discovered it resembled my little golden haired daughter (to a certain extent); Roller Skating Smurfette with red skates and blond pigtails just like hers.

Well, one thing leads to another and I, being an indulgent mother, got involved in building a collection. We bought every different Smurf we could find and, fortunately, picked up every variation we noticed as well. We loved the Supers, too, and hunted down every one.....or, so we thought.

The day dawned when we discovered a tiny brochure in a Super's box and, lo and behold, it showed Smurfs we never seemed to see in any of our stores. At this point in time, my husband got involved and we traveled all over our state checking out every store possible seeking Smurfs, Smurfs and more Smurfs. The "hunt" actually became thrilling; discoveries lurked in the oddest places! But the ones we craved the most, those different ones in the German brochure, began to drive us crazy.

An elderly Aunt in Germany was recruited and she really enjoyed helping us in our quest. Any sincere collector can appreciate the intense excitement we felt when the first packages began to arrive from West Germany filled with our little "treasures."

Now, if I weren't a perfectionist, the S.C.C.I. would never have come to be. At Christmas time I purchased what, after a closer inspection, proved to be a defective Smurf: "Holly Mailman" with messy paint. Of course, I returned it intending to purchase a replacement when the store got fresh stock. To my dismay, that never happened. No one could have known, at that time, that the "Holly Mailman" was a rarity, a fluke, produced in small numbers and never to be repeated.

So began a great quest and finally, in desperation, I submitted my request to the Yankee Magazines Swoppers column.

I received one, and only one, reply. A Long Island, New York, lady wrote to say she didn't have what I wanted but was delighted to learn of another equally devoted Smurf Collector. She hoped I would reply and suggested we could share information and help each other. A friendship developed and, so here we are. The lady, you may have guessed, was to become our intrepid leader, the courageous founder of the S.C.C.I.

SUZANNE'S STORY

Like many of us, my Smurf beginning started with my youngest son in 1978. Then, only four years old, he was taken along on a visit to the home of his Daddy's boss who had just returned from a trip to West Germany. Having a young son himself, he had returned with a marvelous gift. Not one to do things in a small way, he had purchased an entire Smurf Village. My son was amazed to see a whole floor of one room set up with hundreds of little blue guys. He was enthralled and spent hours with the other little boy playing with the magical village of Blue "people."

Upon his return home he excitedly told me all about the wonderful day and all he had seen. Truthfully, I had no idea what he was talking about and I could not, for the life of me, imagine what a SMURF could possibly look like except to take his word for it: they were blue and wore little white hats.

Over the next few months I thought the experience faded in my son's mind. But when in early January, 1980, we were walking through the local Mall, all of a sudden my son stopped and screamed out "SMURFS!" He ran into the store and you never could imagine a happier child. His face was lit up like a Christmas Tree!

The store carried only European imports; they did not have Smurfs from Wallace Berrie! The Wallace Berrie Smurfs were still an unknown factor at this point in time, (too early yet)! Little did I know at the time, we HIT THE JACKPOT right off the bat! All West German, Schleich and Bully figurines.

They had a large showcase filled with all different kinds of the adorable blue figurines, and yes, one Black Smurf! To this day I still will not admit to the amount I spent on that very first Smurf shopping spree. I'll give you a hint! My son wanted a WHOLE village full of Smurfs to set up on his bedroom floor to duplicate the one he had played with that very first time.

Within a few months Smurfs started appearing in other stores (Hallmark and other novelty card shops) but now they were Wallace Berrie Smurfs. Unlike Susan and Gary, I started my son's collection with the West German figurines the ones that could not be found in the U.S. line of Wallace Berrie figurines.

In order to get my son's collection under control, my son and I agreed that he would get new Smurfs as rewards for helping Mom and Dad, for doing well in school etc. I wish those "reward days" were back! Needless to say my son was helpful and he did well in school, so his collection grew and grew until sometime in 1985 when he gradually lost interest in his beloved Smurfs. Well, I will admit that, by this time, Mom was hooked! I adored those little Blue Smurfs. I rescued them all from my son's room, cleaned them all and bought myself two large bookcases. I spent hours arranging them. I set them up in categories; all the musical instruments together, all the Smurfettes together, all the sports together, etc.

Now I was on my own but very little was happening in the world of Smurfs. the History Series was produced, Baby Smurf was introduced and I waited.....and waited.....and waited.....

One day I subscribed to a magazine (can't remember what) but I was informed that the publication of my choice had been discontinued. In it's place I would be sent, on a trial basis, another publication. I received a sample of Yankee Magazine. In my very first issue, ever, what did I find but this tiny ad in the Swopper's column:

Which led to....."HELLO, SUSAN !"

AND NOW....THE STORY OF HOW THE THREE SMURF-A-TEERS MET AND UNITED IN SMURFY BLISS!

When Susan and I started corresponding it was a weekly letter. How I looked forward to my Saturday mail! We discussed what we had in each of our collections. Shared information and learned so much from each other. We were both amazed. I should mention that, by this time, Susan had also acquired her daughter's Smurf collection.

After several months of correspondence I found some Smurf Porcelain figurines in a local shop that Susan wanted to add to her collection. I was so excited I could not wait to write. In 1985, we were all eagerly waiting for the newest Smurfs to appear in our local shops. As advertised by Applause (no longer Wallace Berrie) and due out in June, 1985:

SMURFETTE STEWARDESS
PAPA PILOT

We waited and waited and waited for.....NOTHING! The series was never completed by Applause for the U.S. market. We wrote to Applause and this is the answer we received!!

DEAR SMURF COLLECTOR:

When you're only three apples tall, it's pretty easy to hide! I'm sorry that you cannot locate all the Smurf characters you're seeking. Unfortunately, many of my blue friends have disappeared from the Applause shelves and smurfed back into the woods—even I can't find them! I suggest you hunt for Smurfs in your local gift and toy stores. I hear that some bands of early Smurfs can still be found there, if you look hard enough.


