Dear Smurf Collectors,

Once again we come to the close of another year. With this our 44th Newsletter, we have completed our 11th year of entertaining and informative Smurf Newsletters! Our thanks to all subscribers for your support and sharing of information. Once again, we ask that you keep your letters coming so we, in turn, can keep everyone abreast of what is happening in the world of Smurf Collectibles. Remember our Club motto, "Sharing is Caring".

Our twelfth year will begin with Newsletter 45, Summer 1997. Please submit your renewal applications (enclosed) promptly to ensure delivery of the Club's next issue. We would like to mention, at this time, that the lower your membership number the better your chance of acquiring special Smurf items that become available for sale through the Club. For example in year eleven we had the Handicapped Pair from France, the McDonalds Smurfs from Germany and the Netherlands, plus a few other very choice and interesting items that were featured in our Newsletters. We record membership applications as they are received, each year starting anew. The sooner you submit your renewal, the lower your membership number will be. Each year membership numbers change and your number will appear on your mailing label. **Please make a note of it!** If your membership number is low, you will be among the first to receive our special offers. Quantities of these special-offer items are usually very limited and so this system is used by the Club in fairness to all.

Now we have some disappointing news! In late October, 1996, we were informed that the Irwin Toy company would no longer be handling Smurf Products for the United States and Canada. We held off telling all this news hoping that the Christmas buying season would show some improved figures for their company. We attempted to help Irwin's PR people with some good publicity (see enclosed article that appeared in the Chicago Tribune). But, obviously, it was too little too late. I think we all had a hint that this new line of Smurf products was not doing well. Many of you wrote to tell us that the line was being discounted after a brief appearance in the stores. The Smurf line was also quite difficult to find in the stores; display locations were not good. Plus the fact that, after the first two lines appeared in stores, (the Posables and the Die Casts,) very few stores carried the rest of the new Smurf products (see Newsletter 41).

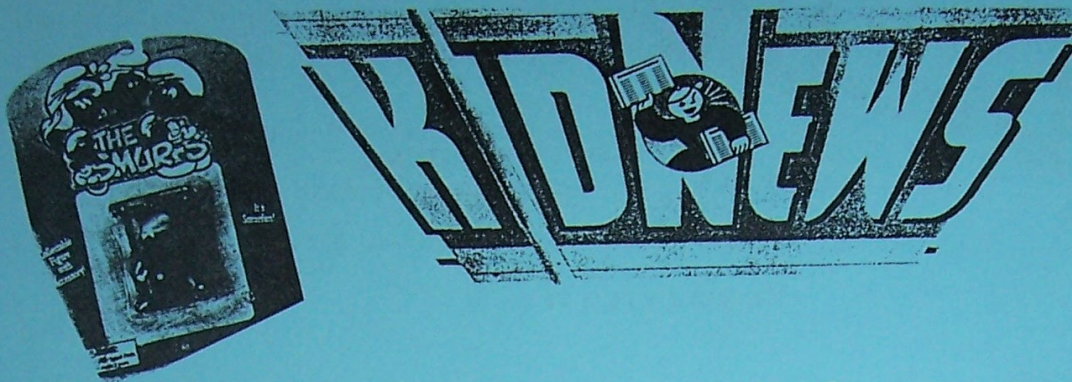
Our Canadian members reported that the Smurf Cartoon appeared later than expected on Canadian T.V. (Fall 1996, instead of Spring 1996). Also, newspaper ads showing the Smurf toys reported vastly different prices from store to store.

In conclusion, I guess we would have to say this is the second failed attempt in the U.S. for a revival of the Smurfs since 1990. It did, at least, present us with an exciting opportunity to add some new items to our collections. Scott Irwin has asked us to tell our members "We hope that all your Smurf Fans were happy for all that we tried to do by putting the Smurfs back on TV in Canada and by making many new Smurf items available in both the U.S. and Canada in 1996. Unfortunately, not enough people bought Smurf items and we lost money. We can't be expected to continue to lose money in 1997. Please inform your members that we did our best and we are probably more upset than any one that Smurf sales were not as high as we needed to make money."

We will keep you informed as to Toy Island's intentions for the Smurf Line in the U.S. and Canada.

SMURF 'N' TURF: Where did the blue dudes come from?

In Belgium they're called Schtroumpf. In Italy, Puffi. In the Czech Republic, Smoullove, and in Germany, Schlumpf.

In the U.S., they're Smurfs — and they're back! (Not that they ever really disappeared — they always have been very popular in Europe. But Smurf-mania snoozed out in the U.S. for a while.) And to celebrate their comeback, we'll tell you where they came from in the first place: The Smurfs were created in 1958 by a talented Belgium comic artist, Pierre "Peyo" Culliford. (He died in 1992, but his family still carries on his Smurfy work.)

Suzanne Lipschitz, founder of the Smurf Collectors' Club International, says Peyo was eagerly awaiting the arrival of his baby and started sketching a magical figure as a gift for the child. After his daughter, Veronique, was born, he had a party to celebrate. His artist friends loved his new drawings of adorable blue gnomes. But Peyo was stumped for a name for his creation. As Suzanne tells it, everyone was eating and partying, but Peyo was distracted because he was trying to think of names. As he thought, he made a sandwich. Wanting to sprinkle some salt on it, he asked one of his friends to "pass me the.... eh.... eh.... le

schtroumpfs...." Translated, "schtroumpf" means "that something" or "that thing." It's a word that the French-speaking Belgians like to use when they can't remember a name.

And once translated to English, "schtroumpf" became "smurf."

The Smurfs are stepping into the '90s just in time for Christmas. Irwin Toy Co. Ltd. has a new line of animated Smurf figures (\$2; that's one to the left), accessories (\$4) and playsets (\$4 to \$25). You can snap them up at Target, Toys R Us, Kay Bee Toys, Kmart and Wal-Mart. Happy Smurfing!

SWEARING SMURF

Wal-Mart pulls Smurf doll after one reportedly swears at girl.

Brantford, Ontario (AP) - A Wal-Mart store has pulled cuddly pink Smurf dolls from its shelves after a woman complained the doll taught her grandchild to swear.

Deborah Osborn of Scotland, Ontario, bought the Berry Luvin' Baby Smurf doll as a Christmas gift for her 2 1/2-year-old granddaughter, Amber because stores were sold out of Tickle Me Elmo.

The family says a squeeze of the doll's hand causes it to giggle, followed by a garbled sentence that sounds like an obscenity.

"My poor grandchild has been punished for saying these words and she got it from this stupid doll," complained Osborn.

Irwin Toy Ltd., which manufactures Smurfs, is investigating after receiving a couple of complaints, a customer service representative said on condition of anonymity. Baby Smurf sells for about \$30.

The Wal-Mart store at Brantford Mall, which sold the doll, removed six remaining boxes from its shelves and sent one to the head office for testing.

"We have no reason to believe there is any issue with the toy," said Wal-Mart spokesman Edward Gould, but he added the toy was removed as part of the company's customer satisfaction policy.

The Smurf's doll face is supposed to change color and say 12 different things, according to the Irwin Toys Internet site.

Osborn said Amber's doll only has one expression, and added she thought the manufacturer should change the sentence to ensure there is no confusion with swear words.

"If it's saying something else, then they should change it," Osborn said. "If a 2 1/2-year-old can pick it up, other kids will pick it up as well."

As a follow-up to this we did ask Scott Irwin about his findings. The following is what he told us about "The Swearing Smurf." "The voice chip that Toy Island produced just talked Baby Talk Gibberish, but a few people claimed to hear bad words when they listened to the doll. It's really like looking at the clouds and "seeing" animals etc. Some clouds do, indeed, look like elephants especially if you're shown which part is the trunk etc. Call it power-of-suggestion, The Smurf toy really just talked baby talk."

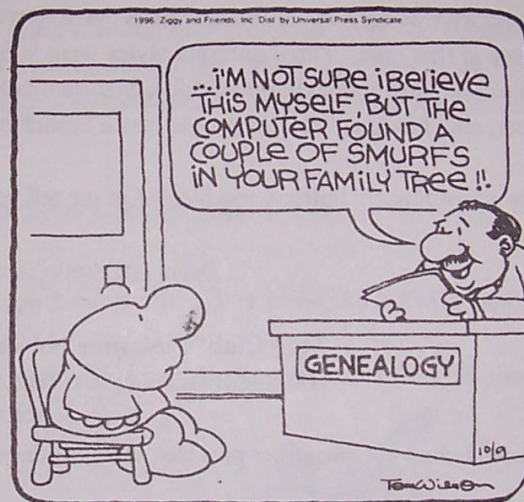

S.C.C.I. MEMBER UNEARTHES SOME RARE COLLECTIBLES.....

Everyone I meet knows my passion about Smurf collecting. Some laugh right at me, some behind my back, but most think my collection is unique! Word gets around about my collection, but I never thought it would get to a salesman who worked for Wallace Berrie in the early eighties, now retired.

One night last month my telephone rang and the gentleman at the other end introduced himself. He told me he had heard about my Smurf Collection from a friend and that he had some items from his Wallace Berrie days that I might be interested in seeing. After a brief conversation I just knew I had to check out this guy's Smurf items.

To make a long story short, we met and he had items that I never even knew existed. Just wish he had quantities of these items for me to share with others but, most items, he only had one.

I have added to my collection a Smurf Calendar; the first ever produced in the United States for 1980. He advised me that these were given only to retail stores that carried the Smurf Line in those early days.

The first store promotional piece entitled "The World of Smurfs." It measures 14" x 24" in beautiful color.

Mock-up boards for the Smurf's cameo TV appearance. An assortment of black and white slick sheets sent to licensees to show Smurf artwork, six characters per sheet, about 10 different pages.

Smurf neckties produced exclusively for Wallace Berrie salesmen. These were given, it is believed, as Christmas gifts to their sales force in 1980 or '81. Three different background colors: brown, blue and burgundy with tiny little Smurfs running around the tie.

Among his other items were Smurf Timex watches, also produced exclusively for the sales people in 1980 or '81. If his memory was correct, he thought these were flown in from England and considered extra, extra, special by the sales force at that time. Three different styles were in his possession; he did not remember if there were others, but he did not think so. The first style showed five Smurfs Cooking Pancakes (Floating Face). The second, four Smurfs Playing Soccer, also floating. The third style was a Smurf with moving arms.

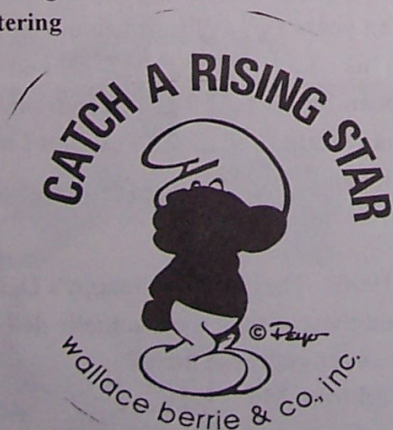
I truly adore Smurfy buttons and pins! Let me tell you, again, I found he had some that I never knew existed!

We noted that it was unknown for whom this Smurf was produced. Thanks to member Barry S. from N.Y. for setting us on the right track, it is **Sabena Airlines!!!** See below:

Is it a bird? Is it a plane? No, it's a Smurf!
The sky really was the limit as the Smurfs become
airborne with Sabena, the national airline of Belgium
and one of the biggest carriers in Europe.



The idea was part of the 100 year anniversary celebrations commemorating the cartoon in Belgium. The amazing popularity of the Smurfs convinced Sabena to include the little blue characters in a series of mar-

keting and publicity campaigns. Consequently, the eye catching blue men have appeared in a wide range of easily recognisable Sabena advertising from press and radio to paintings on the side of trams to window stickers

designed for use in travel agencies. They have also brightened up literature sent to customers of the airline, on packages and timetables for example.



HIGH FLYERS!

The deal to use Smurfs in Sabena communications literally took off when large Smurfs were painted onto the cockpits of Sabena's long-haul A-340 planes, making a daily impact in places as far away as the USA, Africa and the Far-East, which has, like Europe, been swept away by Smurfmania. The sky is certainly blue for Sabena airlines!

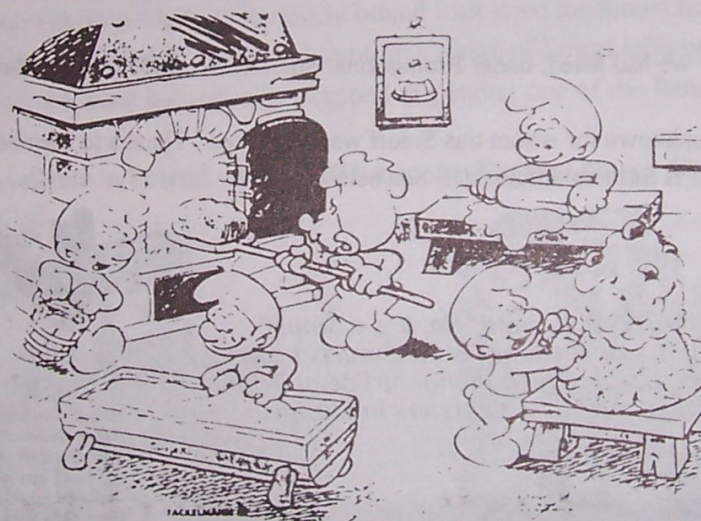


From Germany.....

POLAND "SMERF"

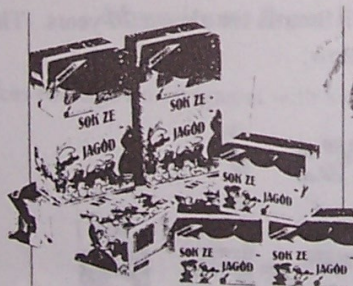

Arogna will produce an attractively boxed fruit juice for Smurf fans.

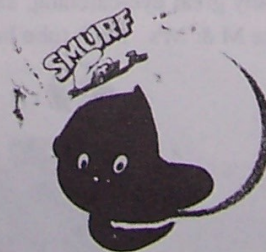

Pierot Luco will be returning to a great novelty idea...selling ice cream filled Smurf Heads.



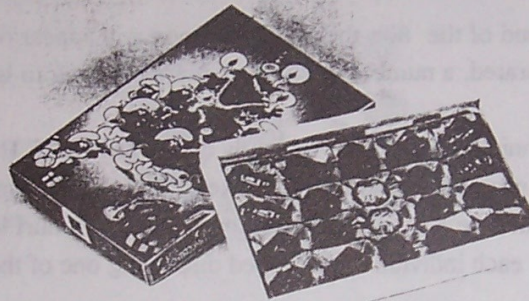
SWEETS, SWEETS, and more SWEETS!

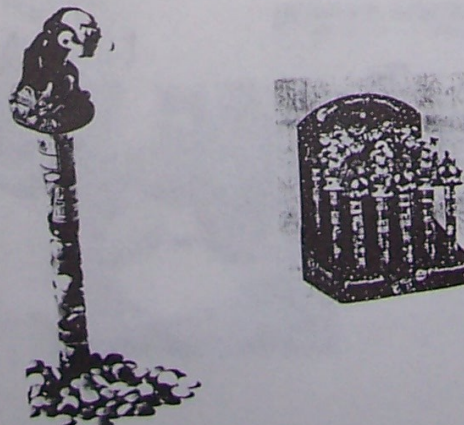

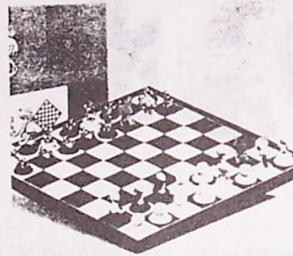

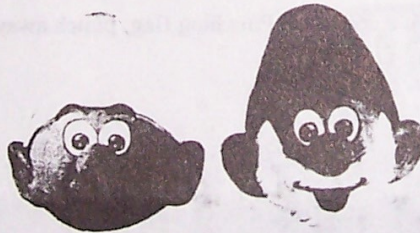
This lamp is great! The heat of the bulb makes the lamp turn. Little Smurfy characters appear to float around!

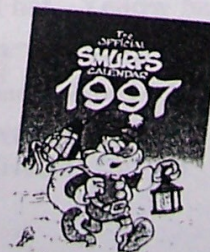
