Hopefully, the infusion of this "new Blood" will ensure the continued popularity of Smurfs thus keeping Schleich financially afloat. If you want to see additional figurines in the future, cross your fingers and toes for good luck and wish Schleich success!!!

We would like to caution our members at this time. When the 1986 Smurfs were issued, they were listed as "Limited Editions". This seems to be holding true, as some of these pieces are no longer listed, in the latest factory brochure, as being available. We suggest that you acquire these as soon as possible. In fact, according to the new '87 factory brochure, manufacture of more than half of the line has been totally discontinued. In addition, very nearly ALL European numbers have been eliminated.

On June 30th, the 14th Annual Daytime Emmy Awards were televised. The Saturday morning Smurf Cartoon was nominated in the category of "Outstanding Animation." Just to be nominated is great! Afraid the "Muppet Babies" won the award. At least we can say it's "All in the Family." The Muppet Babies figurines are also manufactured by Schleich.

In 1982 and 1983, "The Years of The Smurfs in the U.S.A.," a vast number of editorials and articles about the Smurf Phenomenon were published in high circulation magazines and newspapers. We are looking for these articles. Do YOU have any in your possession? We would appreciate originals (or clear photocopies) of any articles you might have relating to Smurfs, Mr. Peyo etc. Local items of interest would also be appreciated! To answer numerous inquiries we have received: To the best of our knowledge #20123, Policeman, was NEVER issued holding a STOP SIGN as it appears in the Club brochure. It was, however, issued with the White Uniform.

COLLECTOR'S COMMENTS

"I have found the Pez dispensers, 1986. I have them in three colors, red, blue and white. I also found one that is different. The dispenser is red, but it doesn't have any "FEET" like the others. This is the old Style. The feet on the bottom is the new style. Thought you'd like to know."

Thank you. Upon close examination, I see you are correct. I didn't spot this myself. Even "PEZ" VARIATIONS!!!!

"Now that the mold injection process has been explained, I have another question. Could you possibly explain to me what the little numbers on the bottom of the figurines mean? Thank you."

Most Smurfs are injected in molds with four cavities. This means that the machine injects 4 figurines at the same time. On the bottom of each cavity is an engraved number. If one figurine comes out of the cavity imperfect, the technician looks for that number and has the cavity corrected or replaced.

"I was recently looking through my entire collection of Smurfs hoping to find at least one with that very rare ^{MP} marking. Being the true skeptic that I am, I was beginning to wonder if it really did exist. After all, I have to see it in Blue and White to believe it. Well, while browsing through the 72 page German catalog one day, I came across about a half dozen Smurfs that clearly displayed this infamous marking. So, Suzanne wasn't pulling our legs..... it really does exist!"

We are finally making some excellent progress in our investigation of Promotional pieces produced by the Schleich factory.

Let's begin with some exciting NEWS! WE ALL OWN AT LEAST ONE VERIFIED PROMOTIONAL PIECE! Number 20160, RED APPLE with #1 TEACHER, is considered by Schleich to be a Promotional piece made for the U.S. Market. The regular stock version of this number is a Green Apple.



The "FANTA" Soda Pop bottle was issued with a Brown Bottle and a Green Bottle.

The "OMO" Smurfs were:

- 1- Smurf #20160 with "OMO" box in the hands.
- 2- Smurf #20068 with "OMO" printed on its back.
- 3- Smurf #20093 with red racquet "OMO" printed on the chest.
- 4- Smurf #20065 "OMO" printed on it's back.

The "BRITISH PETROLEUM" (BP OMURGG) were

1- Smurf #20067 painted in a different blue to pair up with the next piece.
2- Smurf #20058 painted Green Wreath with "BP" printed on the left side of the head, "75" printed on its chest.

These two plazas were built for the company's 25th Anniversary.

The "CARL ZEISS" Smart was

Smurf #20006 The blue color is a different shade. Printed on the back of the head is "Carl Zeiss, W. Germany". This was made for a W. German eyeglass company.

The "CAKE CHURCH" with

Smurf #20080 This was made in Brown and called the Onko Smurf. Company issued for is unknown.

The "PROPHYLAXE SMURF" WAS:

Smurf #20064 "PROPHYLAXE GRUN" printed on the back of the head.
This is a German Toothpaste.

The "GLORIA SMURF" was:

Smurf #20160 holding a round container (Like a CAN) Says "GLORIA" on the container. "GLORIA" is a concentrated milk.

Smurf-Related Hobbies

The Smurf Collectors Club would like to introduce Ron to our Club members. Ron is an avid Smurf Collector, but has also created a marvelous hobby for himself.

"I create my own "Custom-Made" smurfs. At present, I have created over 110 different models, and several playsets and accessories.

Among the playsets that I have constructed are tree houses, castles, a rocket that is IDENTICAL to the one in the comic strip. A complete rock band set up, and many more.

Production of my smurfs may take anywhere from a day and a half, up to a week and a half. For example, the rock band set-up, including amplifiers, lights keyboards, P. A. System and stage took over a month and a half to complete. It also required the construction of nine additional figures and instruments to go with them.

The construction of these "Custom-Made" figures is accomplished by cutting, piecing, gluing, heat welding, sculpting and shaping with X-acto blades and a dremel tool, and various other techniques picked by trial and error during the past several years.

I am happy to report that I am still at work busily constructing Smurfs, playsets etc. in my own private Smurf Workshop."



Below are some photos of Ron's work. Words cannot describe the creative talent this member has. It certainly is an extraordinary hobby.

Chicago souvenir by way of china



Q—Where can we find information about white and purple china that has a picture of the Art Institute of Chicago on it? The backs of the dishes are marked "Johnson Bros, England," with a crown above the wording.

A—The china was produced in England by Johnson Brothers sometime between 1913 and the 1930s. The firm was established in 1883 and was owned and operated by four brothers, Frederick, Robert, Henry and Alfred. By 1914 the company had factories in Hanley, Tunstall and Burslem, making it one of the largest producers of earthenware and ironstone. The company still exists as part of the Wedgwood group (since 1968), although it continues to produce china under the Johnson Brothers name. Throughout the years, Johnson Brothers produced an enormous amount of pictorial china souvenirs, as well as complete dinnerware sets portraying historical buildings and structures. During the 1960s, the company also produced a series of china plates titled "Historic America" that depicted Boston Harbor and other such scenes.

A good source of information is the Souvenir China Collectors Society, Box 562, Great Barrington, Mass. 01230.

Q—Where can I find an antique pine dry sink with a high back fitted with drawers? Also, how do I find the value of country pine furniture?

Q—What is the value of and where can I sell a World War I Army uniform and helmet?

Hwy. 90 to U.S. Hwy. 20—Marengo exit—4½ miles to South Union Road), where the Memorial Day weekend "Military Days" extravaganza will feature twice-daily World War II battle reenactments, a 50-dealer military collectibles show, Wild West shows, family games, contests, food, movies and historical displays.
