

## Rewind

### 10 Years Ago This Week

Once upon a time (OK, it was 1958), Belgian comic-strip artist Peyo Culliford introduced a few new characters into his popular comic strip "Johan and Peewit." They were cute, blue and only "three apples high," and he called these characters Schtroumpfs (loosely translated as whatchamacallits). He would eventually shorten their name to Smurfs.

Soon, the popularity of these little creatures soared, and the Smurfs found themselves magically transported into a series of children's books and plastic figurines. For years the Smurfs lived happily in their native Belgium until one day (OK, it was 1980) American television executive Fred Silverman noticed that his young daughter was collecting the figurines. Silverman had an idea that would surely bring wealth and prosperity to the people at NBC. He would travel to faraway Belgium and request that Peyo create a television series based upon his Smurfs.

#### Fast Facts

1. From 1986-1990, comedian Jonathan Winters was the voice of Grandpa Smurf.
2. *The Smurfs* received two Emmys for Outstanding Children's Entertainment Series in 1982 and 1983.
3. In an attempt to piggyback on the success of *The Smurfs*, NBC launched a cartoon featuring underwater creatures, *Snorks*, in September 1984. It lasted only two seasons.



*The Smurfs* ruled Saturday morning television during the '80s and created a multimillion-dollar merchandising frenzy

Silverman's plan worked, and the NBC Saturday-morning schedule lived happily ever after, or for about the next 10 years. *The Smurfs* was a bona fide smash in North America during the 1980s, bringing in high ratings, two Emmy Awards and millions of dollars in merchandising.

Yet, like many pop-culture Zeitgeists, the Smurfs also became the focus of a number of nasty, word-of-mouth rumors. Among them: the show was sexist because Smurfette was the only female in the group; their white hats were a KKK allegory, so some TV stations refused to air reruns; the show promoted drugs because they ate mushrooms; and the Smurfs were Communists because they shared everything.

Even 10 years after its final airing (Aug. 25, 1990), there are still a number of Web sites that propagate anti-Smurf movements. Well, if that doesn't just Smurf all. 


Collectors Comments.....



Dear Taylor and All Members,






Dear S.C.C.I.,


